# Handprint Dragon

#### Supplies

- Dragon head and tail templates
- Felt tip pens or coloured pencils
- Scissors
- Paper
- Paint
- Paintbrush



- Shallow trays or plates
- PVA glue





First, use either felt tip pens, coloured pencils or paint to colour the dragon head and tail templates.



Once your handprints are dry, carefully cut around them.



Next, carefully cut out the dragon head and tail.



Next, choose a handprint and use the glue to stick it onto the back of your dragon's head, with the fingers pointing towards the tail end.



Now you can start making the dragon's body using handprints! To do this, carefully press your hand into some paint, you may want to use the paintbrush to spread the paint all over your palm. Then gently press your hand onto a piece of paper.



Continue sticking the handprints together to make a long line of them for your dragon's body!



Repeat step 3 about 10 times to make a long dragon. You may want to use a few different colours!



When you have used all of your handprints, stick the dragon's tail onto the end. Allow to dry and then your dragon is finished!

## Chinese Lantern

#### Supplies


- A4 coloured card
- PVA glue
- Scissors
- Sequins
- Glitter
- Ribbon
- Sticky tape







First fold the piece of card in half lengthways. Now hold the card horizontally from the folded edge and use scissors to cut lines which go from the fold, down towards the edge of the card. Make sure that the cuts stop before the edge of the card! Also make sure to space them out so that there is around 3cm between each cut.



Now open the card out and lay it flat so that it is ready to decorate. You can use PVA glue to cover parts of the lantern with glitter. You can also stick on some sequins and lengths of ribbon along the bottom edge.



Once completely dry, bend the card around into a cylinder shape. Secure it in place using sticky tape.



Now make a handle for the lantern.


You can use a piece of ribbon and attach it to the top of the lantern on the inside.






### To make a Bull Corner Bookmark you will need:

- o White square paper OR black/ brown if making a different type of cow, bull or ox
- Scraps of contrasting paper in black, pink and white OR pink/ beige, white, black and yellow depending on final design
- Scissors
- o Glue Stick







- Fold the square paper across the diagonal to make a triangle
- 2. Rotate to bring the long edge parallel, then bring the right corner up to meet the top corner
- 3. Repeat with the corner. You should now have a smaller diamond with a line down the middle
- 4. Open up the last two folds
- 5. Fold down the top corner only take one sheet of paper
- 6. Bring the right corner back up and fold into the flap
- 7. Repeat with the left corner
